healthwatch survey results

Back in April, we invited you to take part in an Accessible Information Survey to help local health and care providers ensure you and your family can get information in a format you can access and understand.

The project led by <u>Healthwatch North Yorkshire</u>, <u>Healthwatch York</u> and <u>North Yorkshire County Council</u> is now complete and more than 250 local people have taken part!

The results and recommendations will be shared at two virtual launch events on **Tuesday 21 June at 10.30am** and **Thursday 23 June at 6pm** to allow as many people as possible to attend.

Each headband is handmade from a wide choice of <u>fabric designs</u> and tailored to your child for a perfect fit! Angela makes headbands for the following types of hearing devices and the <u>reviews</u> speak for themselves!

- BAHA
- BTE (behind-the-ear)
- And implants

£25 per headband (including postage and packaging) or £22.50 each when two or more are purchased together.
