# Sign Language Week

13 -19 March is <u>Sign Language Week</u>, an annual event run by the <u>British Deaf Association (BDA)</u>.

This year marks the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of British Sign Language (BSL) being acknowledged as a language in its own right by the UK Parliament and almost a year since it was finally recognised in law by the BSL Act (2022).

The theme for this year's campaign is: "Protecting BSL" and the aim is to encourage people of all ages to find out more about Deaf language and culture and take up the challenge of learning BSL for themselves.

Help support the BDA's mission to protect, preserve and promote this beautiful, unique, visual language for future generations to come:

## YorSensory Hub relaunch

It's been all go since for the <u>YorSensory</u> team since they moved into their new base in Wilberforce House last summer. Their brand-new demonstration Hub showcasing equipment designed to support people living with hearing loss, sight loss or both officially opened to the public on 20 February.

Having worked through the effects of the pandemic, the service has continued to see a rise in the level of enquiries and support required.

#### In the last six months it has:

- dealt with 247 enquires, 26% relating to deafness;
- completed 50 Community Sensory Assessments;
- given out 761 pieces of advice or information
- designed, reviewed, and expanded the requirements of their brand-new demonstration Hub.



#### YorSensory equipment demonstration

With many pieces of equipment being discontinued or updated since the old Hub in Huntington closed, the YorSensory Team have taken the opportunity to update their selection of telephones, alerting devices, tinnitus relieving devices, daily living aids, technology and much more. This has included working with suppliers nationally to source the most modern and practical solutions.

They have also welcomed the opportunity to develop a relationship with <u>SignVideo</u> to improve accessibility for the BSL community. The team have a subscription to the Video Relay Service and Video Remote Interpreting service enabling people to call them or drop in!

Spring is the perfect season to spot rainbows, so why not take the opportunity to learn the colours of the rainbow in BSL!


If the pictures to the right are a little hard to follow, this short sing & sign YouTube video should help (simply click the icon below to watch)


