

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












Trustees Update

Over the past year, with funding support from <u>The Lottery Community Fund</u> we have welcomed 11 new families to Lollipop! These are some of the comments from members and parents from our recent survey...

"Made friends with another's child in our area. They now play on same football team, go to each others houses to play.
Walks in the woods etc. Parents have also made friends."

"Both us and our daughter have made friends at Lollipop, through drop in sessions in the past and activities later on. Sharing experiences, supporting each other and at the same time have fun."

"Able to talk to other parents with deaf children and gain peer support."

"Opportunity to feel normal and equal to everyone else for a while."

"This is the time for our daughter to spend time in a caring safe space with other deaf people."

"My son made friends with a boy and was happy because "he is Deaf like me"

New 18-25 Deaf Mental Health Service



A 2-year pilot service is to begin in York in early Summer, offering specialist mental health assessments and recommendations for D/deaf adults aged 18 – 25.

Recruitment for the service is currently on-going, and the specialist team will cover the Yorkshire and Humber areas as part of the existing CAMHS. Deaf adults aged 18-25, with a severe or profound hearing level, or problems with speech can be referred to the service by Health or Social Care professionals. In the 2 year period they aim to help up to 80 individuals.
