Halloween is coming...




Our lovely friend Gemma from Hoglets has prepared us some exciting activities for Halloween.

Youth Charity 'Leap' have produced a <u>Transitions handbook</u> for children to work through alone or ideally with a parent to help make that transition easier. It will help them to:

- Know themselves and their strengths
- Reflect on their journey at primary school
- Think about friendship
- Know how they feel and how to manage their feelings
- Understand more about conflict and how to manage it
- Know who to ask for help

BSL e-books for children Frank Barnes School for Deaf Children






